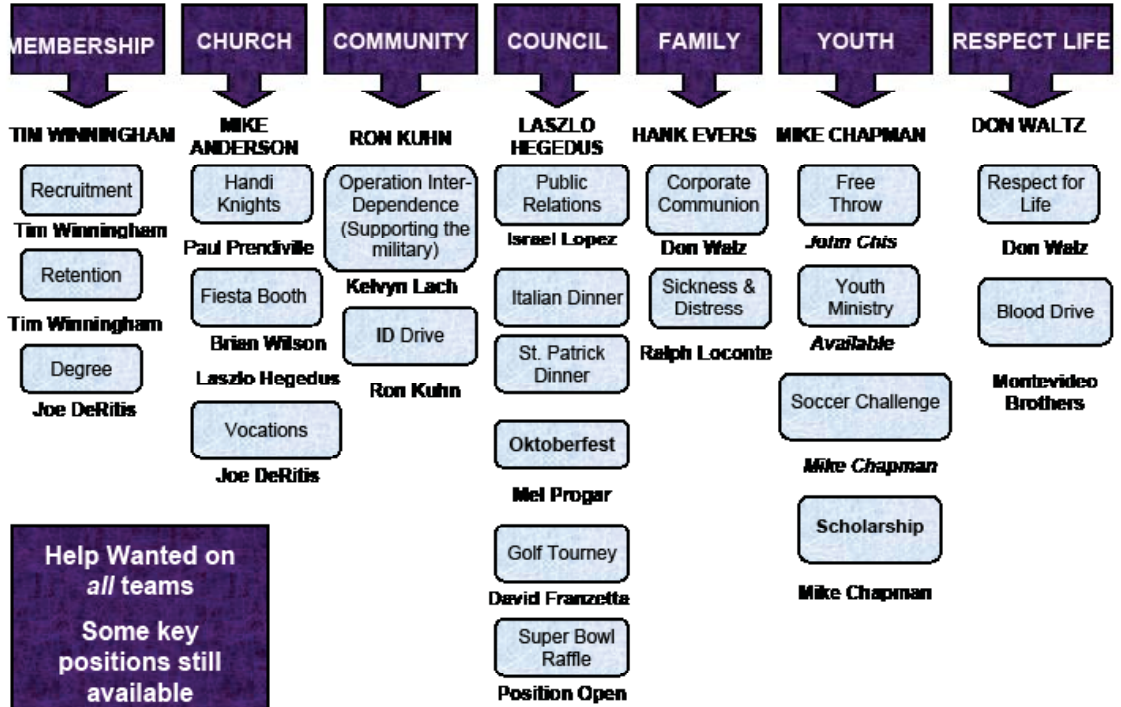

I could go on and on of all the good things we did. These accomplishments could not be possible without you. I thank each of you for your work and support.

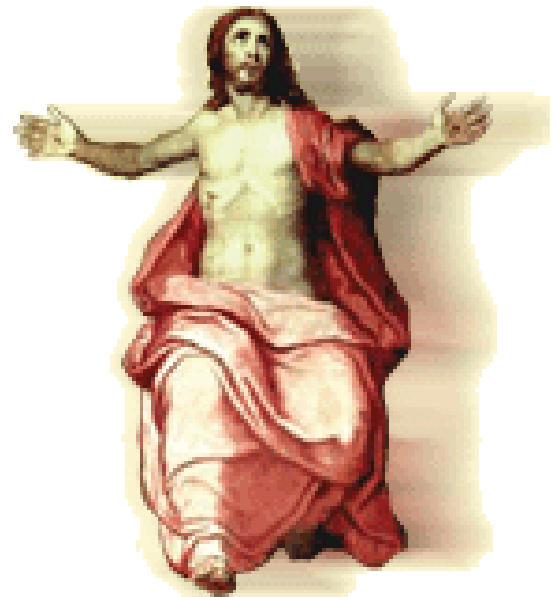
Now, as we enter the last six months of our year we have many challenges ahead of us. However the following three are truly high priority and we must meet our goals for each of them

Chancellor's Corner January-February 2011

The Building of the Knights of Columbus Team Communication Part One Council 12451

The members of the Knights of St Edwards are very blessed to be in such a beautiful and spiritual community with so many active members, but what we are lacking is your vocal participation at our general council meetings. You do make a difference! We would

like to hear from you and get your help in reshaping our council into a stronger voice in our community. We need to unite in our cause to help others and to spread the word of Jesus Christ by our actions.

A team that does not communicate is not a team at all, it's just a group of individuals working towards their own goals. Communication is essential in building a successful team, without it the exchange of ideas, instructions, data, and information would not take place. A team needs to have proper communication in order to function effectively.

There are two sides to communicating, the first side is the speaker (or writer), the other side is the listener (or reader). Barriers of communication can arise due to the fault of either the speaker or the listener. It is the responsibility of the speaker to convey his message in a clear manner that the listener can understand. This requires the speaker to understand the background of his audience and to use the appropriate language to present his message. Also the speaker needs to make sure that he communicates his message to the appropriate people. If a written message is being distributed, it is recommended that the message be proofread and checked for clarity before it is sent out.

The listener should pay close attention to the details of what speaker the speaker says. In order to do this, the listener needs to give his full attention to the speaker and not be doing other things while the speaker is talking. If necessary the listener should take notes. If there is anything that the listener does not understand, he should ask the speaker for clarification. .

If we are following procedures in a timely fashion, then we can accomplish more of our goals, spend time in doing spiritual events and have FUN serving our Lord.

Please join us and the new leadership at our general council meetings in helping us to create a stronger and exciting council that is rooted on the Knights of Columbus .

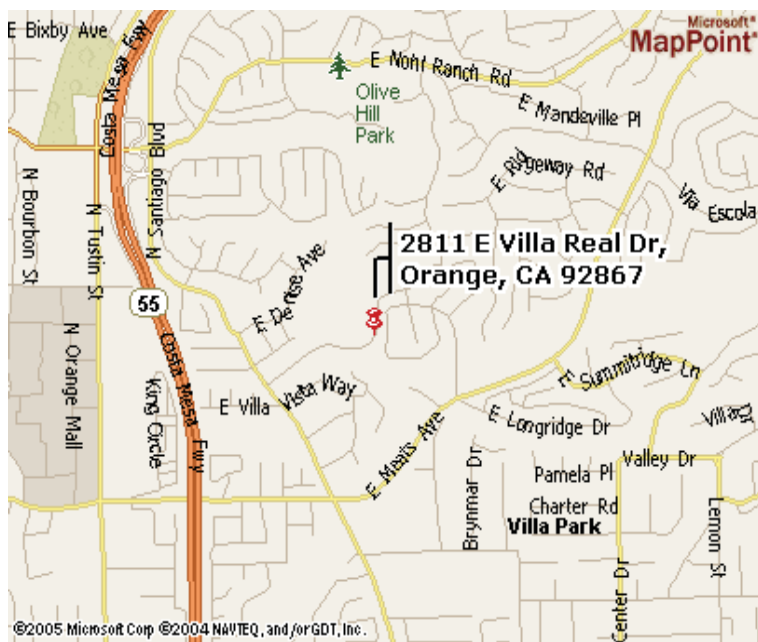

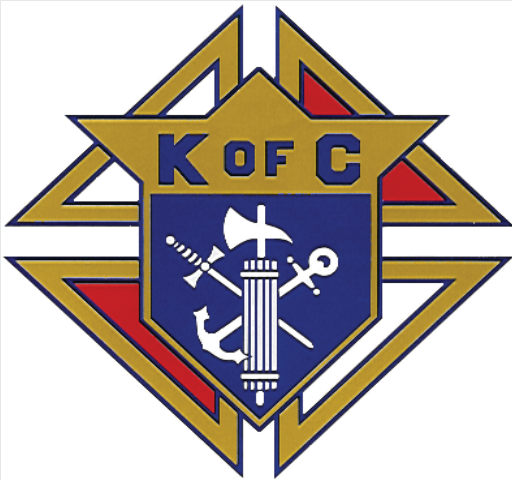
